

English language programs

General English

A structured program to suit all levels, this course follows a general English syllabus and it is an ideal way to develop speaking, listening, reading and writing skills for everyday use.

English for Academic Purposes

The program is designed to prepare students for success in academic study. It develops academic language, problem solving, task-based learning, and research skills they need to accomplish their study goals.

English for Specific Purposes

The program is designed for students who have specific context-based English requirements. The emphasis is the use of vocabulary and structures that students learn in a meaningful context to reinforce what is taught. Example of topics available: English for Engineering and English for Economics.



Beyond the classroom

As a Monash College student, you will continue to learn outside the classroom.

You can join one of the weekly excursions and visit places of cultural significance, or participate in our on-campus cultural activities that are both fun and engaging. You will also have access to the teachers who are passionate about helping you to achieve your learning objectives.

More than ever before businesses and organisations are internationalising their workplace culture. To succeed in this international working environment, graduates and professionals require a specific set of skills, knowledge and experience.

The Global Professional Programs is designed to help students and working professionals to achieve success in globalised workplaces. Participants in the program have access to topics such as fundamentals of international business practice and the importance of intercultural understanding. They will also gain international workplace experience to build their English proficiency and business skills.

Program Structure


The program is comprised of four core units and one optional unit. It is taught over five, 20-hour weeks. The program can be customised for a shorter or longer duration.

Industry and Cultural Engagement

The Global Professionals Program combines training with industry and cultural engagement to reinforce classroom learning with real-life experience. Industry internships of up to 12-weeks can be included and the host city of Melbourne provides many opportunities for intercultural engagement.

Core and Optional Units

The core units in the Global Professionals Program develop essential skills and knowledge for international careers. Optional units allow the program to be tailored for participants at different stages of their career journey - from university students early in their studies through to working professionals.

Note: Industry and cultural engagement - these units are usually scheduled one day per week and may include cultural talks on business in different nations, company visits, guest speakers, participation in cultural activities or events around Melbourne and engagement activities with Monash University students.

Entry requirements

A minimum English language standard of IELTS 5.5 or equivalent is required. Applicants wishing to participate in the Industry Placement or University Engagement internship require a minimum IELTS of 6.0 or equivalent.

Teacher development programs

Teachers of English Program

The program has been designed to further enhance the practical teaching skills of English as a Foreign Language instructors. It develops participants' teaching methodology and practice.

English for Teachers Program

This program provides teachers with the specific language skills needed to teach their subject area confidently in English.

English for Teachers Program

Highlights

- 2** Helps participants to develop clear instructional language through exposure to authentic lectures in their field of expertise.
- 3** Develops the skills required to assess the needs of students and identify barriers that may be causing learning difficulty.

Both programs have been designed in a flexible, modularised way that can be tailored to your needs including the length of program, content of modules and additional language options. For example:

5 weeks of General English or English for Academic Purpose + 5 weeks of Teacher Development Program

Entry requirements

For participants to engage fully in the program, an IELTS of 5.5 or equivalent is recommended. The Monash English Placement Test is offered to institutions to assess the language ability of the prospective participants.




As a study experience student, you will have access to an airport pick-up service, 24-hour emergency phone support, and health and wellbeing initiatives.
