Policy Title

Support for Students Policy

Purpose

This policy outlines the requirements for identifying students at risk of not successfully completing their courses and the support available to these students including Monash College's processes for ensuring that the students are aware of the support available.

Scope

This policy is published in accordance with the Monash College's obligations under the *Higher Education Support Act* for Diploma students approved for FEE-HELP loan.

Definitions

Academic Progress	process by which students are able to advance in their course of	
	study, having fulfilled all academic requirements.	

Policy Principles

Monash College (the College) is committed to ensuring its Diploma students approved for FEE-HELP loan are provided with the support and resources required to assist them to be successful in their studies.

- Student Academic Progress Procedure and Student Attendance Monitoring Procedure
- 1.1 The College applies the Student Academic Progress Procedure to identify students at risk of not successfully completing their unit of study.



- 1.2 Student Progress is monitored, and students are provided with feedback and support early in the course.
- 1.3 The Academic Progress Procedure requires that students at risk of unsatisfactory progress are identified based on a range of early indicators, and intervention strategies are enacted.
- 1.4 The College applies the Student Attendance Monitoring Procedure to identify students at risk of not meeting attendance requirements.
- 1.5 Student Attendance is monitored, and students are provided with interventions early in the course.

2. Support Services Available to Students

- 2.1 The College offers a range of <u>support services</u> to students to assist in the successful completion of their units of study, including:
- 2.1.1 Counselling
- 2.1.2 Disability support
- 2.1.3 Student engagement and welfare
- 2.1.4 Student safety
- 2.1.5 Careers and student development
- 2.1.6 Learning support and study resources

Identify students at risk of, or demonstrating, unsatisfactory progress and issue at risk of, or demonstrating unsatisfactory progress notifications to students	Student Administration
