Admission Procedure

### **Purpose**

This procedure outlines the process for admission into Monash College academic programs.

#### Scope

All applicants for admission to Monash College pathway programs.

ATAR	The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank of a person as calculated by a tertiary admission centre or other authorised body.	
Course	A coherent sequence of units leading to a degree or other award	
Credit	Recognition of a student's previous learning is equivalent in content, learning outcomes and assessment in a form that reduces the requirements a student must satisfy to achieve a qualification.	
Credit precedent	Information about prior approved credit that can be used to inform future credit decisions and as an indication to prospective and current students of potential credit application outcomes.	
Census date	The date when the College finalises enrolments.

International student	A student who is not a domestic student	
Measure of English language proficiency	A way of demonstrating English language proficiency, whether through background, prior education or tests of proficiency.	
Packaged offer	An offer of admission which includes a combination of programs or courses at Monash University, Monash College and/or Monash University English Language Centre, typically studied in sequence with progress to the second course or program being conditional upon the student achieving a minimum result in the first.

### 1. Overview of Admission

As a minimum, this includes:  • Admission requirements for each course, and streams if relevant;  • Any additional selection criteria for courses and streams that use a range of criteria. 1.3	College's website.  Trimester 1 admission requirements for the Diploma programs, where applications are received through VTAC, are published in the VTAC Guide.	University Admissions

## 3. Minimum English language requirements

3.1	The minimum English requirements have been set to ensure students can participate safely in teaching and learning activities and have a reasonable likelihood of success in their study.	Academic Board
3.2	When assessing an applicant's English language, the following is considered:  • The measure of proficiency and level achieved; and • Any time limitations that apply  The time limit is 3 years from the date the English language proficiency test was completed until the course commencement date unless otherwise stated.  Time limits do not apply to the evidence used to demonstrate English language proficiency for applicants who have completed at least 6 years of secondary schooling in an English medium institution in an English-speaking country.  Recency or validity period does not apply to English units completed as part of the academic qualifications assessed for Foundation Year and Diploma Part 1 applicants. The time limit of 3 years applies to Diploma Part 1A and Part 2 for English units completed as part of the academic qualifications assessed.	University Admission

	Competency-based qualifications will not be accepted as meeting academic language requirements.	
4.2	Where a course has prerequisite subjects, applicants must have completed the subjects and achieved the required results levels as published in Schedule A before admission.	University Admission
4.3	Monash University Foundation Year/ Diploma Part 1 Applicants can be offered a place in the Monash University Foundation Year or Diploma Part 1 program, on the basis of their academic achievement in a secondary qualification recognised as equivalent to an Australian Year 11 qualification.  International applicants can be given a packaged offer for a place in the Monash University Foundation Year or Diploma Part 1 program and/or a place in a Diploma course and an undergraduate destination course. Packaged offers will specify the achievement level required in the foundation program or Diploma Part 1 for entry to the undergraduate destination course.	University Admission
4.4	Diploma Part 2 Standard admission pathways to Diploma Part 2 courses, include completion of a senior secondary qualification with graded results and other qualifications considered to be equivalent, such as foundation programs. An applicant can include any prior higher education study to complement their senior secondary school	University Admission



	International applicants can be given a packaged offer for a place in a Diploma Part 2 course and a Monash University undergraduate destination course. Packaged offers will specify the achievement level required in the Diploma course for entry to the undergraduate destination course.	
4.5	Predictive Results For entry to courses and programs for which predicted results are accepted, an applicant's predicted results are treated as equivalent to final results only in the absence of the final results. Offers are made based on the Predictive Results Procedure.	University Admission

## Deferring commencement in a course

Ref	Process Steps	Responsibility
5.1	Commencement of a course or program after acceptance of offer can be defer for a maximum of twelve months.	Student
	Application for deferment must be submitted prior to the commencement of studies before the commencement of the first study period.	
5.2	Students wishing to defer commencement of their studies must apply for deferment.  Deferment requests can be accepted from a student's nominated proxy, e.g. a Monash approved recruitment agent.	University Admission
	International students subject to ESOS requirements can only be granted deferment in compassionate and compelling circumstances.	
5.3	The College reserves the right to request to undertake an English test to meet the English language requirements.	Applicant
5.4	To be eligible for admission, an applicant must age requirements set in Schedule A and website.	Academic Governance and Quality



## 6. Cancellation of application, offer or enrolment

6.1	Students currently suspended from Monash programs are not eligible to apply for entry to any other Monash College program.	University Admission
6.2	The College reserves the right to request original documents be provided at any stage of the application process.	University Admission
6.3	<ul> <li>Admission may be refused on the grounds that:         <ul> <li>The applicant is not eligible to be considered for admission to a course</li> <li>The applicant has previously been suspended or excluded from Monash or another educational institution</li> <li>admitting or enrolling the applicant may place the College in breach of a law or a legal requirement</li> <li>The applicant is found to have falsified information that would otherwise have led to their application being rejected</li> <li>The applicant failed to disclose information that would have led to their application being rejected</li> <li>The applicant has breached any of the terms and conditions of application or offer.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
6.4	Conditions can be imposed on an applicant's admission or enrolment if necessary to ensure compliance with law or legal requirements.	University Admission
6.5	An application, offer or enrolment can be cancelled or suspended if the applicant has outstanding money or fees which are past due.	University Admission Student Administration

### 7. Internal transfer between award courses

	Current students can apply to transfer between award courses.	
7.1	Students are recommended to seek advice from Student Administration prior to making a course transfer application.	Student Administration
	Application and approval must be completed by Day 4 of the new study period.	



	To be eligible for an internal course transfer, students must meet the admission requirements of the new course.  Meeting the minimum admission requirements of the new course does not guarantee a course	
7.2	transfer will be approved.  Students will only be approved for a course transfer where there is evidence the student will be successful in the proposed course.  Credit for prior learning will be assessed as per	Team Leader of proposed course
	the Admission Policy, and will ensure the student has the opportunity to meet the minimum requirements of the new course.	
7.3	If the student is considered to be At-Risk or have made unsatisfactory academic progress, the application will be assessed by the Team Leaders of both the current and proposed course.	Team Leader
7.4	Advise Monash University Admission of course transfer application outcome.	Student Administration
7.5	Process course transfer application and advise the student of the outcome.	University Admission
